

Evaluation and Examination

- The overall weightage of a course in the Syllabi and Scheme of Teaching and Examination shall be determined in terms of credits assigned to the course.
- The evaluation of students in a course / subject shall have two components unless specifically stated otherwise in Syllabi and Scheme of Teaching and Examination:
 - (i) Continuous evaluation by the teacher(s) of the course (i.e. Internal Assessment).
 - (ii) Evaluation through a Semester term end examination (i.e. External Assessment).
- The guidelines for distribution of weightage for various components of evaluation shall be as below:

(a) Theory Courses

- (i) Continuous evaluation by teacher(s) : 25%
- (ii) Semester term end examination : 75%

(b) Practical / Laboratory / Studio Courses

- (i) Continuous evaluation by teacher(s) : 40%
- (ii) Semester term end examination : 60%

- As per present approved Syllabi and Scheme of Teaching and Examination of the concerned programme, distribution of maximum marks of each course / subject is as follows:
